

TIPS FOR STUDENTS TO SHARE WORK ON ZOOM

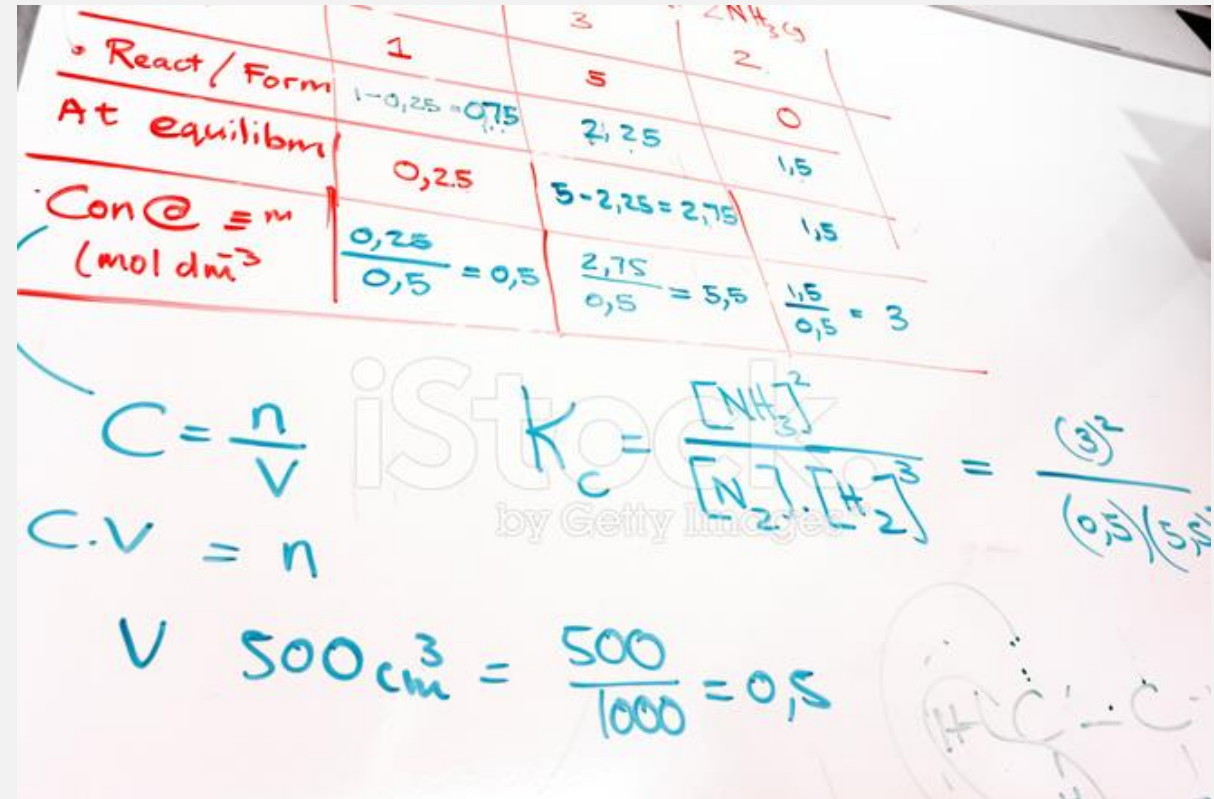
TRADITIONAL BLACK/WHITE BOARD

Students can choose to mount on a wall and point the computer camera at the board

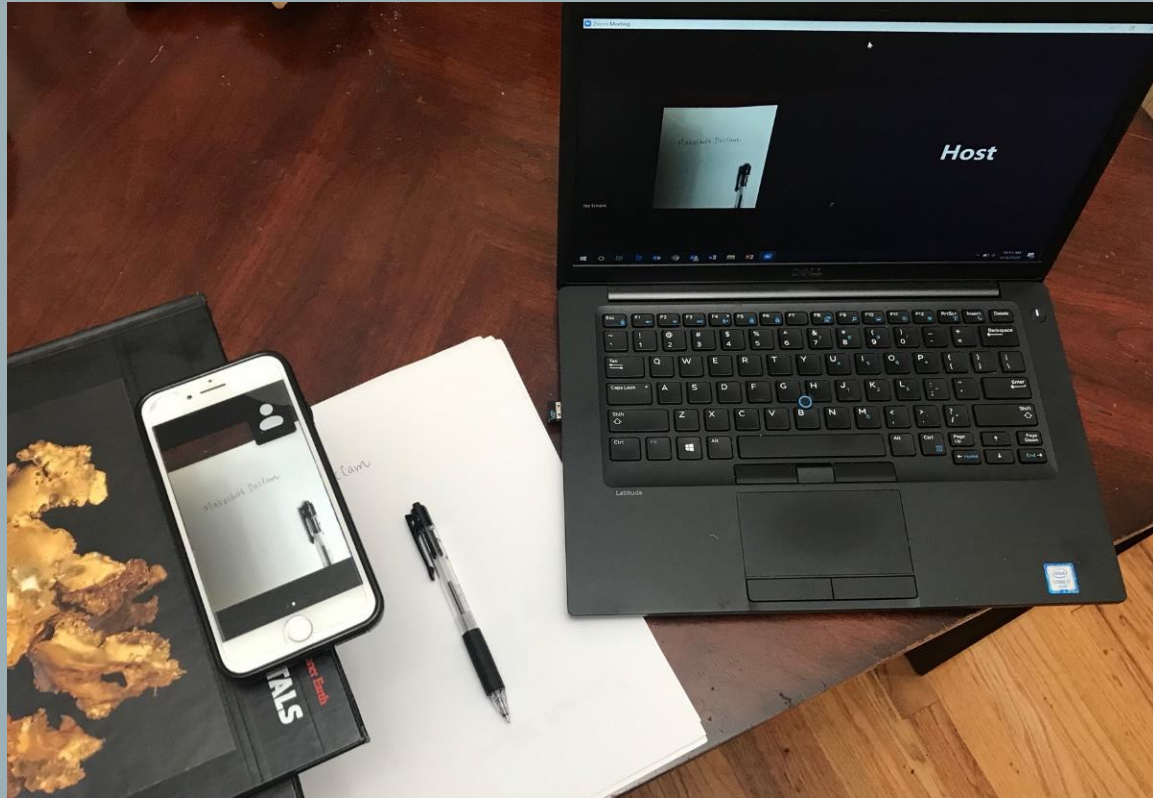
Light weight, portable, can be held in hand for sharing work

MAKE SHIFT DOC CAM WITH ANY SMART PHONE



Can do this with both Android or iPhone.

Requires good wireless connection

Requires joining the Zoom meeting from your computer and smart phone.

Smart phone camera can act as a quick document camera.

Write on notebook or paper and share work.

Instructions

Download the free “**ZOOM Cloud Meetings**” app on your phone

After you join your Zoom session on your computer, join the same session using your phone by opening the Zoom app. **Disconnect audio on your phone** to avoid feedback issues.

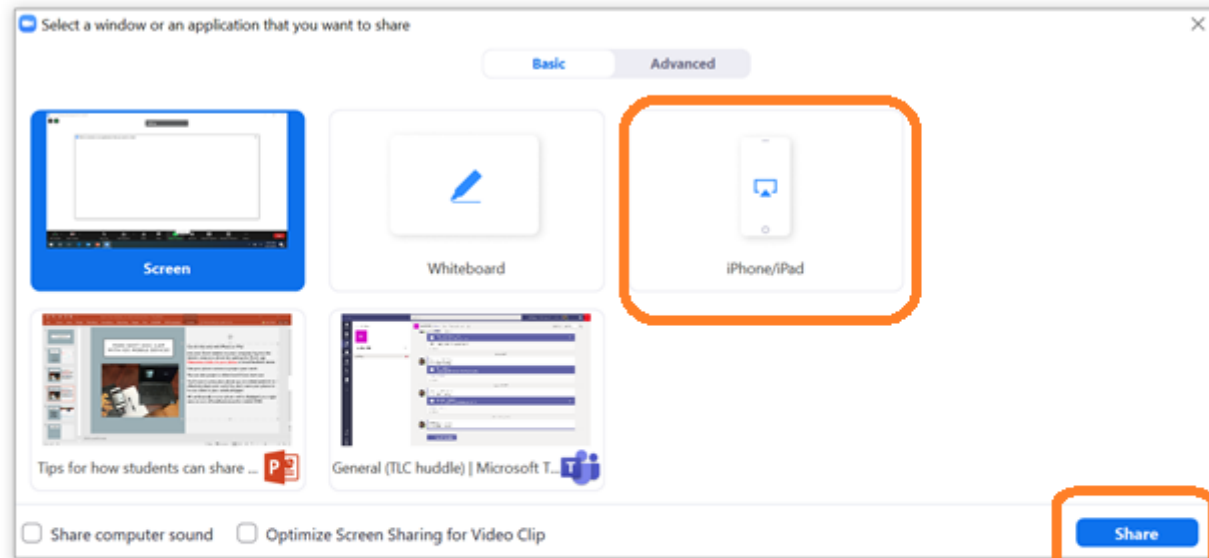
Use your phone camera to project your work

You can also project a white board if you have one

You'd want to prop your phone up on a raised platform to effectively share your work. You don't want your phone to be too close to your notebook/paper

All notifications on your phone will be displayed, you might want to turn off notifications and/or enable DND.

SCREEN MIRRORING WITH IOS MOBILE DEVICES



Can do this only with iPhone or iPad.

Need to log in to Zoom through computer.

Need to connect mobile device to the same wireless network as the computer

Mobile device can act as both doc cam and touch screen device to write on directly.

Requires planning to organize notes on the mobile device if used as a writing pad.

Instructions

Join Zoom session on your computer.

Select **Screen Share** and select the **iPhone/iPad** option and share

Follow directions on mobile screen to mirror iPhone/iPad screen onto Zoom.

Once mirroring begins, leave the screen and open up google doc or one note or a drawing pad on your mobile device to write and share your work

Can also open up the camera on your mobile device and project your writing on your notebook or paper or even whiteboard.


All notifications on your device will be displayed, might want to turn off notifications and/or enable DND.

ANNOTATE DIRECTLY ON LECTURE SLIDES OR WORKSHEETS ON ZOOM

Check if Annotation is enabled

Students should be able to toggle the Zoom control bar and click on **'View Options'** and select **'Annotate'**.

Students should be able to see the annotation control bar. Directly draw or write on the materials shared on screen

Note. Condition labels indicate the order of study (S) and test (T) periods. Subjects rated how interesting the passage was (1 = *very boring*, 7 = *very interesting*), how readable the passage was (1 = *very easy to read*, 7 = *very difficult to read*), and how well they believed they would remember the passage in 1 week (1 = *not very well*, 7 = *very well*).

WORKING TOGETHER ON A SHARED FOLDER
