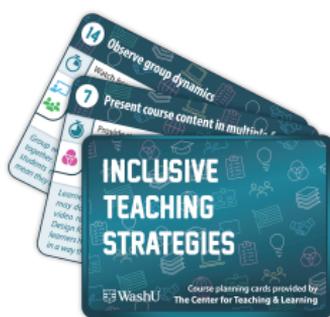


INCLUSIVE TEACHING STRATEGIES
